

Saki's 1980s Trivia Game

Rules

Everyone is divided into 2 teams, with each team having a captain. For large teams, only a fixed number of chosen people from a team may participate any given time, this number designated by the game show host. Any of the chosen people may answer a question. New players from each team are rotated in and out after each turn.

Each question is worth \$100-\$500. Questions should be selected randomly.

The punishment for answering a question when it isn't your play is for your team to lose their turn.

Each correct answer wins the team the amount shown. Each wrong answer (including follow up questions) passes the same question to the opposite team. There will often be a more difficult but related follow up question if the original question is answered correctly. The same chosen people that get the original question are the ones to answer the follow up question.

With the exception of the follow up questions, the questions are posed to the team who DID NOT answer the previous question. This helps keep the score closer to even and ensures more participation.

Questions tagged LIGHTNING ROUND are posed to both teams simultaneously. The first team to reply with the correct answer wins. Only the first answer is accepted so teams are advised to think before answering.

Questions posed to both teams at the same time are flagged with ALL PLAY.

Players under the age of 18 should be distributed about evenly between the two teams. They may answer any question asked to anyone on their team.

The team with the most money at the end wins.

Each team has an anonymous vote for the MVP on the team. Players cannot vote for themselves. The winning team and the MVPs of each team win a prize.

While web sources are provided, many are outdated as this game was originally created several years ago.
